Charitable Giving

We support numerous community causes through our Charitable Trust.

Our philanthropic focus extends to more than 100 organizations that serve low-income and at-risk individuals; promote education, health, and the arts; and support diversity initiatives.



Some of our recent contributions support victims of child abuse and human trafficking, a collaborative venture to assist Topeka's unhoused population, and year-round STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics) activities for Boys & Girls Clubs of Topeka.

The Charitable Trust, overseen by 13 employee leaders in the company, also provides funding for enrichment opportunities that might otherwise be out of reach. The <u>Veterans</u> <u>Community Project</u> creates tiny house developments in Kansas City. Elementary school students in disadvantaged neighborhoods learn ballet through a <u>Kansas Ballet Company</u> afterschool program. Developmentally disabled adults find employment opportunities through <u>TARC</u> and <u>Capper Foundation</u>, and children participate in theater programs in partnership with the <u>Topeka Performing Arts Center</u>, the <u>Lawrence Arts Center</u>, and the <u>Jayhawk Theatre</u>.

Our more than 500 employees also give time and money to various initiatives that enhance overall well-being.

Through our Dollars for Hours program, employees who volunteer 50 hours or more each year can convert time spent coaching, chaperoning school events, or serving on a board into a company contribution of \$150 or more for a nonprofit of their choice.

Employees can also make individual donations to schools and universities and the Charitable Trust will match their amounts up to \$3,000 per associate per year.

Each fall, employees paint, pull weeds, pack backpacks with food staples, and provide other labor to assist <u>United Way of Kaw Valley</u> agencies through the organization's communitywide Nancy Perry Day of Caring, for which Security Benefit serves as the premier sponsor. Many employees visit classrooms during the year to teach business concepts to students through <u>Junior Achievement of Kansas</u>. In partnership with <u>Meals on Wheels</u>, employees deliver meals to elderly and homebound residents so they can live independently.
